The positivity encapsulated in this proverb reflects grace, compassion and a bright future. That positivity also has to be in the 'now'. That positivity and creativity was exemplified with the Art from the Heart exhibition staged at the school last week. The messages that children shared through their pieces was deep learning at it's best.

I am proud of my staff for the process they went through with students, as they drove the focus on a particular New Zealand artist and the consequent product. This is no small feat as handing over ownership to the class isn't as easy as it sounds. Our move to digital real time reporting will allow this time of creativity to flourish as we move from the time-consuming traditional written report. Your written feedback has been substantial in number and quality. You can be sure that this motivates and inspires teachers and students alike. What a great way to end the year!

Room 20 and 21 are currently being refurbished and should be ready by the start of Term1. These new rooms are slightly different to our traditional classrooms as they have interlinking spaces that can be used by teachers and children to work collaboratively. Parents with children in these rooms will be given more information about these new classrooms next year, and there will be opportunities to come and see learning in action in an Open Day, date to be confirmed.

This morning you received an email of your child's class and teacher for next year. These decisions are made carefully, taking a number of factors into consideration. We are unable to accommodate requests for a particular teacher from parents.

Linc-ed is our new online Student Management System which we implemented in Term 2 this year. Teachers have been entering information about your child's learning across this year. Parents will be able to access this information online early next year. We will have parent/ whanau evenings detailing how Linc-ed works, including log-in and passwords. You will then be able to print out a summary of progress if required.

With these type of celebrations there is also some sadness as we honour those that are moving on to new adventures. Paul Mahler is moving to Tauranga, winning a position at Tauranga Primary. Brittany Reekie has been chosen to teach at a primary school in Rarotonga. Richard Yates will be teaching at Halsey Drive School.

In turn we welcome Lisa Piper (Y0/1), Jonathan Kelly (Y5/6), Val Devereux (Y5/6) and Zak Andersson (Y3/4) to Hillpark in 2020.

Digital safety is a primary concern in this day and age. It has come to our attention that several Hillpark students have Tik – Tok accounts. Tik -Tok is a social media site with very little security or monitoring. The recommended age for joining is 16 years of age. We have observed some of our students making inappropriate videos in school uniform, and uploading them, as well as more innocent material such as singing and dancing to a song. I have been in touch with Family Zone, a company specialising in internet safety. They have informed me that this site is a dangerous place for children to be involved with. As it is open to whoever wants to view content, it is littered with violence, racism and pornography. Students of your children's age are therefore vulnerable to members posing as another identity. Be aware of your children's online activity and help us educate them about the pitfalls of this type of social media exposure.

The end of the year is such a positive (and sad) time for our Year 6 students. It is a tradition in some schools to have one's peers 'sign' their shirts. We have made a decision not to allow this, as parents have made it clear that they do not appreciate the practice. This includes other shirts that are not school uniform. Many wish to donate uniform or save it for siblings. We embrace organised water activities and a host of other fun activities for our graduates but not the defacing of clothing.


